

PROPOSED MINUTES
LEGISLATIVE COORDINATING COUNCIL
December 2, 2024

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dan Hawkins at 2:30 p.m., Monday, December 2, 2024, in Room 548-S, Statehouse.

1. Chairperson Hawkins presented the minutes of the meeting of the Legislative Coordinating Council held on November 14, 2024, for consideration and approval. Vice Chairperson Ty Masterson moved that the minutes as presented be approved. Representative Chris Croft seconded the motion. The motion carried.
2. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Gordon Self, Revisor of Statutes, who explained that there are joint committees that require authorization by the LCC to meet and for members to receive reimbursement of expenses for meetings held during the 2025 Legislative Session. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved to approve such authorization. Senator Rick Wilborn seconded the motion. The motion carried.
3. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Self to present recommended prices for the Kansas Statutes Annotated volumes and the Supplemental volumes thereto. Such recommended prices are to be established to recover the actual costs of printing and binding such volumes. Due to savings in materials and supplies, the recommended price for the KSA volumes remains at \$30 per volume and the recommended price for the Supplemental volumes is reduced to \$8 per volume. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved to approve such recommendations. Representative Croft seconded the motion. The motion carried.
4. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Vice Chairperson Masterson who provided information related to 2023 Senate Bill No. 229 that provided increases in judicial salaries including the determination of Kansas district court judge tied to a federal district court judge. Vice Chairperson Masterson stated that the salary of the Revisor of Statutes has been traditionally aligned with a Kansas district court judge. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved that commencing January 1, 2025, and annually thereafter, the salary of the Revisor of Statutes shall be aligned with and equal to the salary of a Kansas district court judge set pursuant to 2023 House Substitute for Senate Bill No. 229 (K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 75-3120n). Representative Croft seconded the motion. The motion carried.

5. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Tom Day, Director of Legislative Administrative Services, who provided information on the constituent relationship management software service process. Mr. Day reported that on October 23, 2024, the Legislative Coordinating Council approved Indigov Corporation to be the vendor to provide Constituent Relationship Management Software Services (CRM) for the Legislature and authorized the LCC Subcommittee on Administration to negotiate the contract subject to final approval by the LCC. Mr. Day indicated that the Office of Revisor of Statutes made suggestions for revision of the subscription agreement. Indigov accepted all such suggested revisions. Mr. Day stated that the LCC Subcommittee on Administration recommended a starting number of 150 user licenses for the first year. Mr. Day recommended that the LCC approve and authorize the Speaker to sign the finalized Subscription Agreement Order Form and allow the Director of Legislative Administrative Services and Revisor of Statutes to work with the vendor to make final revisions to the agreement in line with the full Council's modification requests, if any. Representative Blake Carpenter moved to approve such recommendation. Representative Croft seconded the motion. The motion carried.

6. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Day who presented an update on the KLISS modernization project. Mr. Day stated that the KLISS Modernization Project Steering Committee, with the agreement and support of the legislature's software vendor, Propylon Inc., jointly recommends that the production deployment of the KLISS bill drafting system happen after the 2025 legislative session. This adjusted timeline will ensure that the legislature has a mature and stable system for its use, allow for thorough system testing through parallel data entry in both systems, and allow for the completion of additional system functionality before the start of the 2026 legislative session. The bill and amendment drafting system are to be completed by June 30, 2025, under the terms of the contract. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved to approve such recommendation. Representative Croft seconded the motion. The motion carried.

7. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Day who provided an update on the bill tracking service proposals. Mr. Day indicated that demonstrations for the five prospective vendors will be scheduled soon. Demonstrations will be available to view at the convenience of LCC members. The vendor proposals will be sent to members prior to the demonstrations.

Upon completion of all business before the LCC, the meeting was adjourned.
